



History of the Nord Pazifischer Sängerbund

est. 1901 in Bellingham, WA

Background

The Sängerfest tradition in Germany goes back many centuries. Richard Wagner gives us good examples of this tradition in his 'Meistersinger' opera, which tells the story of a highly competitive song festival in Nürnberg in the 17th century, and his opera 'Tannhäuser' takes us back to the legend of a 'Sängerkrieg' at the Wartburg in Thüringen during the 14th century. German speaking immigrants brought this song festival tradition across the Atlantic, and the first half of the 19th century saw a rapid expansion of singing societies and festivals in all of the major cities along the Eastern Seaboard, such as New York, Philadelphia and Baltimore. Within decades there were song festivals down the Ohio Valley, further west in places like Milwaukee and then across the continent, as the West was slowly opening up. With the westward movement of settlers and immigrants, it did not take long for the Sängerfest tradition to reach the West Coast. There was a big Sängerfest in San Francisco in 1852, the Gold Rush Sängerfest, and within decades there were over 50 German Singing Societies in the Los Angeles and San Francisco areas.



The Nord Pazifischer Sängerbund

Developments in the Pacific North West were not far behind. New singing societies were established in Portland (1858), Spokane (1883), and Victoria started their Germania Choir in 1861. But the opportunity to form a regional Sängerbund did not come about until the last decade of that century, when Portland hosted the first big Sängerfest in the North West. That event inspired the start of five more choirs within the decade: Walla Walla, Tacoma, Seattle, Everett and Bellingham. The decision to form this new Sängerbund was finally made at a festival meeting in Bellingham in 1901: Seattle was given the first official Sängerfest for 1902; Walla Walla com-

peted for the second one; and Portland was determined to get the 1905 Sängerfest to coincide with the Pan American Exposition to be held in Portland during that year.

The Golden Years 1902 - 1913

There are very good reasons to call this period 'The Golden Years'. The highlights of the first Sängerfest included a parade through Downtown Seattle, the Grand Concert with Orchestra, Soloists and the Mass Choir, as well as the Prize Singing for the individual choirs, in addition, of course, to a variety of evening entertainment. Just look at the headlines of The Morning Oregonian from July 29, 1902: Sang With the Band "Die Wacht am Rhein" - Walla Walla Gets Next Annual Meeting – Tacoma Wins Song Prize. The Morning Oregonian seems to have been especially impressed by the parade. To quote some of their observations: ...leading the parade were patrolmen ... on meddlesome steeds ... the band struck up "Die Wacht am Rhein" ... the enthusiasm of the marchers bubbled over and hundreds of lusty voices joined in singing the fatherland's national hymn ... the Portland and Spokane Societies were attired in long brown dusters with soft brown hats ... the Whatcom Concordia members carried white umbrellas which they twirled rapidly ... provoking bursts of applause ... the Tacoma Sängerbund in brown uniform with peaked cap, carrying canes ... nearly 5000 men were in line, and the display attracted the attention of many thousands of Seattle citizens. Also mentioned in the report was that Tacoma had won the singing competition. The prize, a two foot beer stein, was promptly filled and passed around to start the evening festivities.

The only sour note was a comment that the parade had to be cut short to make sure the singers would get to the Concert on time.


All in all, a remarkable and extravagant event that inspired the other members of the Sängerbund to stage a series of lavish festivals with extraordinary musical presentations and unprecedented community support and involvement. Over the next 11 years there were 8 more song festivals. After Seattle, there was Walla Walla, Tacoma, Portland, Spokane and Everett, before the second cycle started again with Seattle and then Walla Walla in 1913. Each one of the hosts, of course, was determined to stage the best and biggest Sängerfest. The pride and competition among the choirs assured the ongoing growth and success of the Sängerbund, and created a growing appreciation by the audience and the host cities of being a part of this tradition.

No one in Walla Walla in 1913 could have imagined that anything could ever happen to derail the next scheduled Sängerfest. But, this cultural tradition came to an unforeseen and sudden end, damaged beyond imagination – and 'The Golden Years' were over.

The rebuilding Years 1925 - 36

It took years to rebuild the leadership in the choirs and the confidence to stage the first Sängerfest again after the decade of turmoil. Some of the smaller choirs like Everett and Walla Walla were unable to regain their membership. It was

Portland took the lead in 1925, gathering a much smaller group of choirs to launch the restart again. And indeed, it was a very successful Sängerfest, most of all as it gave the choirs the resolve and determination to continue with their beloved tradition. Next was Tacoma (1927), Seattle (1929),



Portland (1932) Spokane (1934), and back to Tacoma again in 1936. It was a gradual rebuilding process, but a very enjoyable process as it brought the choirs together again, to enjoy their singing, to meet their old friends again and to be proud of the Sängerfest traditions.

But then – and unlike lightning that never strikes twice at the same place – history struck and repeated itself, and the song festival, that was scheduled to follow Tacoma, never happened.

Since 1952

This time it took 16 years before the Sängerbund could gather their confidence to start the old tradition one more time. Only Portland, Spokane and Seattle were left, as Tacoma was unable to rebuild their organization. Fifty years after hosting the first ever Nord Pazific Sängerfest in 1902, Seattle took the lead one more time in 1952, starting the tradition that reaches all the way to our Sängerfest today.

The three choirs started out in 1952 with big hopes and realistic expectations, and by 1960, with the addition of the Vancouver Alpen Club Choir, the Sängerbund was able to present a most impressive return to festival singing. Who could forget that evening at the old Seattle Opera House (and there are still some among us who clearly remember that evening with the big Orchestra, the beautiful Solo Voices and the impressive Mass Choir). The next Sängerfest was in Vancouver (1962), and with the addition of Vancouver the momentum of the Sängerbund activities shifted gradually north of the 49th parallel. Numerous choirs were formed in B.C. during the sixties and seventies, largely due to the huge

immigration wave during the preceding decades, and not surprisingly, more and more song festivals were hosted north of the 49th parallel. In total there have been 25 festivals since 1952. There were four each in Seattle, Portland and Spokane. North of the 49th there were six in Vancouver, two in Victoria and another two in Nanaimo. In the Interior,

there were two in Kelowna and one in Prince George; all in all, a healthy and dynamic sign of the Sängerfest tradition in the Pacific North West.

A few things have changed over this time period. For example: the two day musical extravaganza of the Great Con-


cert – Individual Choir Singing has changed to a concert format with individual presentations followed by the Mass Choir; the prize singing was introduced again in the mid sixties and dropped again a few years later; the huge immigration wave went through a natural cycle returning the Sängerbund to eight choirs, as in 1902; and Yes, our aging voices are maturing – like aging wine.

While many things may have changed, the central essence of the Sängerfest has not and never will change, that is: to bring like-spirited choirs together; to enjoy singing - in your own choir, with the mass choir and during the celebrations and festivities afterwards; to meet old friends again and to make new ones; and, to proudly be part of this century old German Tradition.

The origins of our Concordia Choir can be traced back to the *Gesangsverein* Concordia that was organized by German pioneers in 1868 in the Spokane area. Through the steady influx of German immigrants the *Gesangverein Frohsin* was founded in 1892, and then the choir of the Turnverein (Gymnists) was founded. On the 1st of June, 1911, these three choirs united under the name "*Gesangverein Arion Spokane*". In 1993 *Gesangverein Arion* decided to change their name back to Concordia Choir, which is the name that is used today. With exceptions of the two world wars, our Concordia Choir has continued to preserve and maintain German musical and cultural traditions. The Concordia Choir members belong to the German American Society of Spokane and meet regularly for club functions at the *Deutsches Haus* on West 25 Third Avenue. The Concordia Choir is incorporated as a non-profit organization and its mission is to promote the German culture in song. We are 31 active singers; most are of German origin.

The choir performs several public concerts during the year at the *Deutsches Haus*, and organizes a German Christmas service in December at one of the local churches. The choir also performs by invitation for other groups and charitable institutions.

As part of the North Pacific Sängerbund, Spokane hosted Sängerfest (song festivals) in 1934, 1958, 1969, 1974 (in conjunction with "EXPO 74") and most recently in 1993.

We are happy to participate in the 40. Sängerfest in Vancouver, and we wish to extend our good wishes to MGV Lyra for a successful event.

German singing in Victoria dates back to 1861 when the first *Victoria Singverein* was founded. The *Harmonie Chor* was established in 1961 with 40 members and its founding conductor, Mrs. Gretl Adam. Practices were held in the Norwegian Hall, and focused on a repertoire of German folk songs and *Lieder*. Within a year of its founding, the choir joined the North Pacific Singing Federation or *Nord Pazifischer Sängerbund*. In 1967, the *Harmonie Chor* hosted the 21st North Pacific Choral Festival which brought 200 singers and their guests to Victoria. In 1971, the *Harmonie Chor* joined the newly formed Victoria Edelweiss Club and adopted the name Edelweiss Harmony Choir. In 2001, celebrating the *Sängerbund's* 100th anniversary, the festival was again held in Victoria, with close to 500 singers and 1000 enthusiastic followers attending.

Traditionally the choir presents two concerts per year, one in the spring and one at Christmas. These concerts serve both as musical and social events for our appreciative audience of mostly German-Canadians. The choir has also sung with visiting choirs from Germany, at seniors' residences, at the public library, and recently as guests of the Greater Victoria Concert Band in their tribute to German music. The number of singers has now settled at about 30. Our conductor is Dr. Angelika Arend, whose communicative skill and musical sensitivity are reflected by the choir's well-tutored and engaging performances. The choir benefits further from the professional musicianship of our piano accompanist Iryna Graifer. Our new, dedicated and efficient president Angelika Morris, and a small executive, look after the choir's business affairs.

The harmony of German songs has sounded in the Puget Sound area for a long time. Already in 1884, years before the famous Seattle fire, a German Singing Society was in existence.

On October 13, 1910 our Verein Arion was founded and German songs were heard at rehearsals from the Arion Hall in the Pioneer Building. In 1926 the "Arion Verein" merged with the Seattle Liedertafel, which originated in 1892.

The name "Arion" was taken from the Greek mythology. Arion was a Greek poet and player of the lyre in the seventh century B.C.

"The Gesangverein Arion (German Singing Society)" is a member of the North Pacific Sängerbund which was founded in July 1901 in Bellingham. The first North Pacific Song Festival was held 1902 in Seattle with guest choirs from Portland, Spokane, Tacoma, Bellingham and Everett. Together, thirty nine Song Festivals were held in different cities of the Pacific Northwest. Seven of these were hosted by the "Gesangverein Arion" (a mixed choir) in Seattle. We are a close-knit singing group and it is our desire to uphold the German word and song for us and those who will follow.

MGV Lyra Celebrates 50 Years

With the dissolution of the Alpenclub Mixed Choir a group of interested singers, some part of a double quartet, including Adolf Fluested, Paul Floch, Hans Hirsekorn, Willy Pfortmueller, Kurt Schäfer, Thomas Spann and Richard Wolf, met in the Alpen Club in late 1964 to prepare the ground for the formation of a male choir.

After a few Monday practices in the basement of the Vancouver Alpen Club, it was decided to begin in earnest in January 1965, as a group of singing soccer players, Gerd Koenig, Hans Poggenpohl, Norbert Schottko, Willi Soehn, Eddie Ternes, Tony Ternes and Willi Ternes, and the infamous group of "Biltmore Musikanten" consisting of Alfred Knauer, Horst Kuehn, Wolfgang Kuehn, Otto Picha, Ewald Wiese and Harald Zimmermann plus new prospects Alfred England, Wolfgang England, Lothar Hirt, and Hans Rosenfeldt were interested in becoming a part of this new venture, but not available until the new year.

Tuesday became the official rehearsal day as Wolfgang England was singing with another choir on Mondays. Unfortunately the VAC had no liquor license and since singing and beer are a time honoured marriage much time was spent before and after rehearsals at the Eldorado Hotel to bond and sooth sore throats.

Alfred Knauer, an accomplished violinist, who had honed his skills in a Russian POW camp, was appointed as the conductor. He was extremely well liked during his many years of dedicated service and will always be remembered for giving the tone using his violin. During his tenure the choir acquired the nickname of "Knauers Barden" – Bards as a result of an article written by Herbert Winter for the German newspaper.

A strong bond of camaraderie and an enjoyment of singing swiftly developed. Practices were anticipated with enthusiasm, gusto and dedication and focused on learning the technique of singing in a four voice choir. A uniform consisting of dark blue blazer, grey slacks, white shirt and black bow tie was adopted and much to the surprise of the fledgling choir, at their debut in the Spring of 1965, the audience responded with a standing ovation. Participation at the Sängerfest followed in the same year in Portland, Oregon, where the choir listed under the name of Vancouver, BC "Alpenclub", Männerchor sang Morgenrot, Heimat and Hobellied. Soon thereafter, the members, after much debate, agreed to the name MGV LYRA – after an ancient Greek musical instrument.

After an auspicious beginning the choir has continued to attract new members. This was particularly so after each of the Germany trips undertaken in 1974, 1988, 1992 and 1997. As well, the choir has been an integral part of the Vancouver Alpen Club and has performed there on countless occasions. In addition, the powerful voices of the LYRA Mens'

choir have resounded in many communities throughout British Columbia and the United States. Particular memorable are our trips to Los Angeles, San Francisco and Calgary. As well as, the exchange visits with other member choirs of the North Pacific Sängerbund. Thank you for those many invitations and for being such fantastic hosts. This year marks the 20th time that the choir has participated in the Sängerfest – Wow a trilogy celebration – 50 years LYRA and 40th Sängerfest.

There have been many musical accomplishments and highlights but memorable are the singing of the aptly number 13 in our song book – Wagners, "Chorus of the Returning Pilgrims", the performance of the "Battle Hymn" in San Francisco, the singing of 'Frieden" in Borken and Berlin and the rendering of "Der Wanderer" at the Sängerfest in Portland.

Condensing 50 years of choir history to one page does not do justice to the many events and activities that the choir has undertaken and experienced and would be seriously flawed if it did not include a heartfelt thank you to all of our conductors and accompanists for their contribution and dedication in helping us keep the tradition of German Song alive. Thank you as well to all who have worn the LYRA blue and to those present singers who are continuing to uphold the custom envisioned by our founding members.

It is unfortunate that during our existence we have seen the departure of member choirs from Abbotsford, Chilliwack, Nanaimo, Prince George and the only other male choir "Frohsinn" from Seattle. Thank you for your camaraderie and many years of enjoyable singing.

Who knows what the future will have in store?
